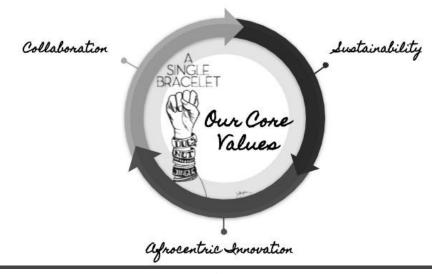


## About Musau Evaluation Consulting

In 2017, founder Agnès Kabambi had a vision to teach nonprofits how to better plan and evaluate their efforts. Agnès noticed that many nonprofit organizations did not have the capacity to evaluate their work. Often, organizations started to think about evaluation as an add-on at the very end of a project, rather than an iterative process that flows throughout the program.

Musau Evaluation Consulting was founded to shift this trend, partnering with nonprofit organizations to build the knowledge, capacity, and skills needed to advance evaluation practice of nonprofit organizations. Our vision is to create beautiful, thriving communities with access to sustainable, innovative grassroots approaches to development.

In 2019, MEC ZINE was launched to create a platform which brings folks together from various communities, to help honor our core values of Sustainability, Afrocentric Innovation, and Collaboration.

As members of marginalized communities, our experiences are complex and diverse. MEC ZINE is a space where these stories come together to be told and shared, heard and honored. It is a collection of thoughts and feelings, a tapestry of individual threads of art that come together to tell a collective community story.

MEC ZINE is a physical and online zine that publishes the stories and art of individuals who belong to marginalized communities. We believe that everyone has a story to tell,and that together these stories can paint a picture that honors the diversity of individuals' lived experiences. Four times a year, we publish a zine showcasing these stories. Want to get involved in the work we do? We're always on the hunt for artists to contribute to the zine, volunteers to keep our machine ticking, and nonprofits to partner with.

Each zine focuses on a different theme related to a social issue and is distributed for free to communities around the United States—and one day, we hope, around the globe!

## Q1 **Overview**



The Q1 2019 MEC ZINE, "Breaking Barriers" was published on March 22, 2019. Our Q1 Zine had 152 impressions and 54 views between March 22-March 31.

The top countries viewing our zine are the United States with 47 views and France, with 7 views. 80% of viewers accessed the zine via our website, while 20% accessed the zine directly from the Flipsnack website.

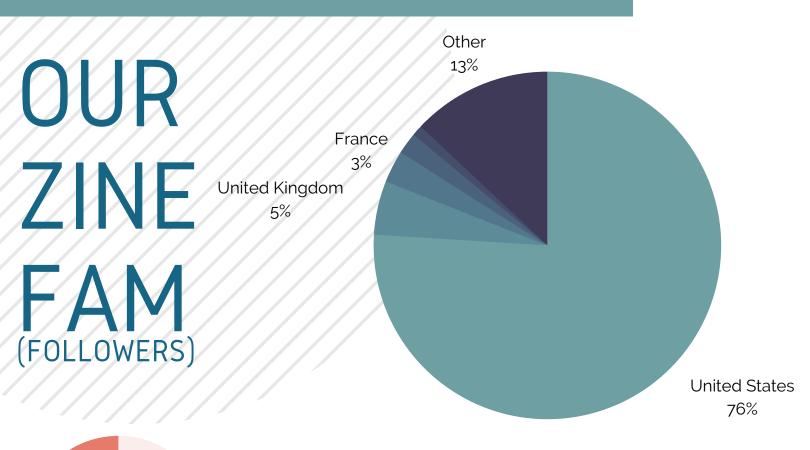

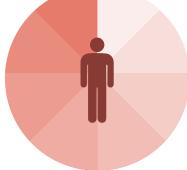

#### 56 PERCENT AGE 25-34



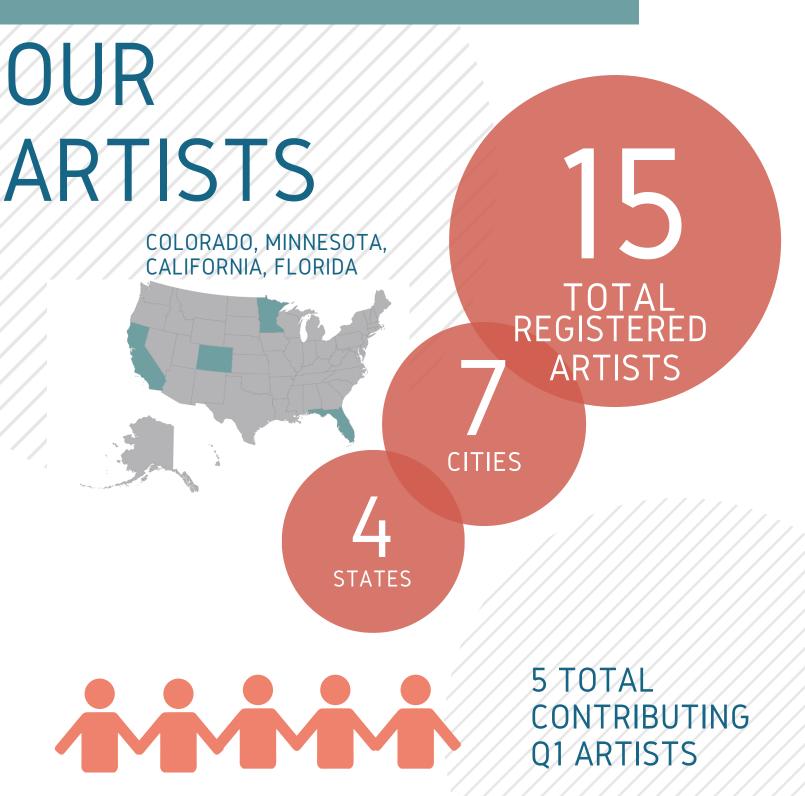
